Patricia O'Neill	Patricia O'Neill, GCMHC Clinical Director was filling in for Peter Konrad today. Pat discussed GCMHC's new Child and Family Clinic Plus initiative. GCMHC has been a designated provider since April 2007. It is a proactive and preventive approach to treatment using emotional well being screenings. In a year GCMHC is expected to do 754 screenings other than those done at a regular intake. Examples of areas being considered as a location to screen are at school kindergarten screenings, pediatrician's offices, school physicals, probation and with kids coming out of foster care. Parental consent is always a barrier. Families must be involved in treatment. Clinic Plus provides for home visits and an enhanced Medicaid rate for services.
