Governor Kathy Hochul announced that an additional \$196 million has been awarded to support 488 projects across multiple New

York State from state agency programs that participated in Round XI of the Regional Economic Development Council initiative. This year, \$525 million in resources from state agencies was made available to support community revitalization and business growth consistent with the REDC strategic plans.



In a Three-Year comparison of Sales Tax Revenue received by Greene County through December 13th, 2021 surpassed 2020 by almost 21% and 2019 by over 24%. – a \$6.5 million increase year over year.

Capital Facilities Projects

2021 saw the advancement of multiple capital facilities projects throughout the county, implemented to improve the health, safety, and economic well-being of all who live, work, and visit Greene County including:



The Greene County Solid Waste Transfer Station in the Town of Hunter, NY received significant improvements in both access and capacity with the construction of a new 4,000 square foot solid waste transfer building.



The new Greene County Sheriff's Office and Corrections Division facility was completed in the Town of Coxsackie, with modern detention units, and specialized areas for training, probation, and rehabilitation services.



The Greene County Legislature is planning a new Community Health Services Building at the Catskill Exit 21 West site and the extension of natural gas infrastructure to support development of the site as a medical campus.



Greene County and its municipalities will receive more than \$6.3 million in state funding for local road repairs and maintenance as part of the 2021-2022 State Budget- a 33% increase in infrastructure funding over last year.



The Greene County Legislature is planning a new Criminal Justice Center adjacent to the County Courthouse in Catskill upon the successful demolition of the old jail and reconditioning of the site.

The SMIP provides funding to implement projects, programs, or management efforts that serve to protect water quality within the Schoharie Reservoir watershed area that is part of the New York City public

water supply. The SMIP offers funding for government agencies, streamside landowners, schools, and 501(c) (3) organizations involved in stream stewardship. All programs and projects funded through SMIP must support water quality protection and stewardship. Windham, Jewett, Ashland, Prattsville, and the Villages of Hunter and Tannersville all lie wholly within the Schoharie Watershed with the Towns of Hunter, Lexington and Halcott - being partially within this watershed. A new study of economic impact and infrastructure requirements was recently completed in partnership with the Town of Cairo, County Legislators from District 8 - Cairo, and the Greene

County Economic Development Team. This study serves as a springboard for a previous plan to attract manufacturing and distribution companies to a new 120+ acre site on the north side of the junction between NYS Routes 23 & 32, and paves the way for the next investment in a shovel-ready industrial park in the town. Greene County Initiates Broadband Survey

Greene County initiated a broadband and cellular communications project to identify households and businesses without access to fiber or coaxial broadband service and to formulate a technical solution and its estimated cost to providing service. In the initial broadband survey (pertinent to homes and businesses both with and without access)

respondents entered an address, indicated whether it is for a home or business, then proceeded to a survey designed to collect information on demand for services unique to their location. Responses to the survey surpassed the target goal by an additional 50% with approximately 1,200 locations participating.

Greene County continues to work with local internet providers in support of accessing State and Federal grant funding.
