Greene County Housing Sales/ Median Price On-The-Rise



The median housing price for closed sales in Greene County during the third quarter of 2020 rose an amazing 31.0%, from \$185,000 in 2019 to \$242,400 this year, according to the NYS Association of Realtors. Housing sales rose year-over-year in the third quarter of 2020, with 250 closed sales vs. 224 a year ago. Housing inventory on the market fell from 863 properties a year ago to 498 now, a 42.3% decline.

New Business Applications Rise Significantly



With preliminary Census data showing that new business applications in New York are up 42.5% in 2020 compared to 2019, and increased responses to our Invest In Greene program efforts, the Greene County Economic Development Corporation is focusing promotion of their Business Support Programs & Incentives (https://greenecountyedc.com/ business-support/development-incentives/) to attract jobcreating start-ups and existing firms to our communities. Promoting the county as Affordable, Beautiful and Commutable - the Invest In Greene program anticipates more and more interest due to remote working and the low population density of our rural county.
