WHEREAS, Agricultural District No. 124 was approved by the Commissioner of New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets on August 2, 2004 and modified on February 8, 2005 in accordance with Resolution No. 478-04; February 15, 2006 in accordance with Resolution No. 415-05; February 15, 2007 in accordance with Resolution 382-06; February 6, 2008 in accordance with Resolution No. 435-07; January 27, 2009 in accordance with Resolution No. 471-08; January 15, 2010 in accordance with Resolution No. 379-09, February 15, 2012 in accordance with Resolution No. 46-12; and December 19, 2012 in accordance with Resolution No. 404-12; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 25-A, Section 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law of New York State the Greene County Legislature has designated an annual thirty day period as September 1st through September 30th within which a land owner may submit a request for inclusion of land which is predominantly viable agricultural land within an Agricultural District prior to the county established review period; and

WHEREAS, upon the termination of such thirty day period the County Legislative Body shall follow the procedure proscribed by Article 25-A, Section 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law of New York State; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board has compiled a report of its recommendations as to whether the requested land be included in the agricultural district as consisting of predominantly viable agricultural land and serving the public interest by assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry within the district; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held by the Greene County Legislature on December 18, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislature has considered factors contained in Article 25-A, Section 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law and of 6 NYCRR Part 617 (State Environmental Quality Review), with respect to said district and proposed additions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after due deliberation and pursuant to the Agriculture and Markets Law, the Greene County Legislature hereby determines that the amendment to Agricultural District No. 124 recommended by the Greene County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board will not have a significant adverse environmental impact and therefore an Environmental Impact Statement is not required; and be it further


