




EXTENSION OF EMERGENCY ORDER No. 4

On March 15, 2020 a State of Emergency had been declared in Greene County due to the threat to public safety produced by the effects of the ongoing COVID-19 Virus, affecting all portions of the jurisdiction.

On April 20, 2020 Greene County enacted Emergency Order No. 4, pre-approved by NYSDOH, closing, or preventing from opening, any and all public and private camps and/or schools which provide overnight accommodations.

By the powers vested in me as Chairman of the Greene County Legislature and pursuant to New York Executive Law §24, I hereby extend Greene County Emergency Order No. 4 for an additional FIVE (5) day period or until rescinded or extended by subsequent order, in order to preserve the public safety and render available assistance vital to the well-being and health of citizens of Greene County. This extension of Greene County Emergency Order No. 4 shall become effective January 25, 2021.


1. Anyone who knowingly violates any emergency order is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.


