Net Migration from NYC to Greene County Expands



A new report from the Center for Economic Growth details the population migration from New York City to Greene County since 2020. The number of federal tax returns filed from people moving from Brooklyn, Manhattan and Queens to Columbia and Greene Counties increased by 159.3% from 2019 to 2020. New Course Offerings at C-GCC



Columbia-Greene Community College has developed a program of cannabis-related courses to keep up with changes brought about by the legalization of cannabis in New York State and tremendous projections for new jobs and industry growth. The college this fall will begin offering two programs that specialize in distinct areas of training, one in business and the other in science. NYS will provide \$5 million to support the courses offered at 4 SUNY Community Colleges. 

Solaris to Embark at the Historic Catskill Point



Solaris is the Hudson River Maritime Museum's 100% solar-powered tour boat and floating classroom. She was built by the museum's restoration crew on-site at the museum's Wooden Boat School. Solaris is the only solar-powered boat in operation on the Hudson River and does not require fossil fuels to operate. It will be arriving at the Historic Catskill Point on August 15th and offering tours to the public at 6pm and 7:30pm.
