

EXTENSION OF EMERGENCY ORDER No. 1
as amended.


On May 17, 2023, a State of Emergency had been declared in Greene County due to the threat to public safety produced by failed federal policy(ies) together with New York City's mismanagement in declaring and providing sanctuary care to persons in need of temporary assistance and housing, which now is or threatens to affect all portions of the jurisdiction.

On May 17, 2023, Greene County enacted Emergency Order No. 1, amended September 12, 2023 which, in part, makes it unlawful for a foreign municipality to make contract with persons, businesses and/or other entities within the County to transport persons in need of temporary assistance and housing to locations inside the boundaries of Greene County.

Emergency Order No. 1 also makes it unlawful for any hotel, motel, or owner of a multiple family dwelling to contract with or engage in any business transaction with any other municipality other than Greene County for the purpose of providing housing or accommodations to persons in need of temporary assistance and housing without a license granted by Greene County.

By the powers vested in me as Chairman of the Greene County Legislature and pursuant to New York Executive Law §24, I hereby extend Greene County Emergency Order No. 1, as amended, for an additional FIVE (5) day period or until rescinded or extended by subsequent order, in order to preserve the public safety. This extension of Greene County Emergency Order No. 1 shall become effective October 2, 2023.
