

# You may be eligible for assistance with Medicare costs!!!

Find out if you're eligible for these programs, how to apply, and other ways to save on your Medicare coverage.

- Medicare Savings Program (MSP): This program can help pay some or all of your Medicare premiums, co-payments and deductibles. To qualify, you must have Medicare Part A and meet income guidelines.
- Low Income Subsidy (LIS): Also known as Extra Help, this program, available through Social Security, can assist in paying Part D premiums, monthly premiums, annual deductibles, co-insurance and co-payments.
- Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC): Administered by the Department of Health, this program helps seniors with Medicare pay for their prescription drug costs.

# Nutrition Notes

Earth Day is celebrated annually on April 22 and can be celebrated by taking strides to protect the planet. Locally, there are annual activities to promote sustainability such as a cleanup of a particular street, park, or small local town. In bigger cities there are rallies or larger scale organized cleanups in efforts to spread awareness and make a difference on Earth Day. Individual impact can be as easy as planting a garden, reducing food waste, or having a yard sale.

Many strategies can help waste less food. Most of them also help with meal prepping and planning, making trips to the grocery store a little easier. Take an inventory before you shop- including the fridge, freezer, and the pantry. Shop for the items you are running out of, but also come up with meal and snack ideas with the foods that need to be used. Keep quantity in mind. Buy produce for a certain number of meals. For example, "fruit for 3 days" or "lettuce mix for 3 salads". Because fresh food shelf life is



less, mapping out how much you need will reduce spoilage. Be cautious with buying in bulk. If items are "buy one get one free" but it spoils, it does not save you money. Remember to store food appropriately and use the freezer if you catch a sale. Lastly, use parts of food you might normally toss. Examples include making croutons out of stale bread or using overripe vegetables in a soup.



Starting a garden at home is another way to honor Earth Day, save money on food, and increase physical activity. You can also use a compost pile to nourish the soil. If you have food scraps left, they make great fertilizer. Always choose plants that work in your soil and climate. Decide whether you want to try growing from seed (can be tricky) or begin with starter plants. A fun Earth Day idea could be planting seeds in egg cartons in preparation to


transplant them later. Map a space in the yard with adequate sunshine. Plant with knowledge and continually care for your garden with sun, water, fertilizer, rotation, etc. When it comes time, enjoy your crops!

Ask around your local community for Earth Day festivities. It is a great day to make an impact on the planet.

# GREENE COUNTY DEPARTMENT of HUMAN SERVICES CONTRIBUTIONS POLICY

For services under the Older Americans Act and in Community Services for the Elderly and Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly projects which propose contributions, such contributions must be used for costs allowable under applicable regulations and incurred during the budget period that contributions were received. The suggested contributions will not be more than the actual cost of the service. The purpose is to offer participants the opportunity to contribute and to increase the units of services, particularly to those in greatest need. Envelopes are provided to participants that desire to make voluntary and confidential contributions.

Services will not be denied to anyone unable or unwilling to make a contribution.

**CONSULTATION and ASSISTANCE:** This includes such client assistance activities as case assistance, HIICAP, help with public benefit applications, etc. The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00 per office visit.

**IN-HOME SERVICES**: This is discussed with the client by the case manager at the time of assessment. The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 per hour

**LEGAL SERVICES:** The suggested level of contribution is \$10.00 per consultation

#### **NUTRITION:**

Home Delivered Meals, Senior Congregate Dining or Mom's Meals:

The suggested level of contribution is \$4.00

Nutrition Counseling

Clients requesting diet counseling from the Registered Dietitian are provided with an opportunity to contribute. The suggested level of contribution is \$5.00.

#### TRANSPORTATION:

Shopping Bus

The suggested level of contribution is \$3.00 round trip

Senior Center Transportation

The suggested contribution is \$1.00 for round trip

Medical (Homebound) Transportation

All tolls are to be paid directly by the passenger. The suggested contribution for this service is a sliding scale based on mileage

0-10 miles \$3.00 round trip 11-20 miles \$5.00 round trip 21-40 miles \$9.00 round trip 41+ miles \$15.00 round trip





# **News From the Greene County Youth Burea**

#### WHAT IS THE GREENE COUNTY YOUTH BUREAU?



The Youth Bureau operates under the Greene County Department of Human Services to fund and assist in both the development and implementation of programs and services for young people. Our major responsibilities include advocacy and programs aimed at improving and enhancing the funding of the welfare of county youth. It is funded by NYS Office Children and Family Services, and the Greene County Legislature. By

assisting in the development and funding of youth programs, youth are encouraged to become involved, develop a sense of responsibility, and make a positive contribution to their communities.

The purpose of the Greene County Youth Advisory Board is to develop and recommend policy and procedures that guide the activities of the Youth Bureau. The Board is a policy making board responsible for the direction of the Youth Bureau. Members possess qualities that enable them to function effectively by recognizing the needs of youth in the community and take an active role in working toward building a ongoing care systems. Important personal qualifications include leadership, ability to positively interact with others, a commitment to representing the interests of youth, and a willingness to devote time and effort to the board's goals. Official appointment is made by the Greene County Legislature.

#### YOUTH BUREAU REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS 2023-2024 FUNDING

The Greene County Youth Bureau is a division of the Greene County Department of Human Services that funds and assists in both the development and implementation of programs and services for children and young people under the age of 21. The major responsibilities of the Youth Bureau include advocacy and the funding of programs aimed at improving & enhancing the welfare of Greene County youth and families. The Greene County Youth Bureau is funded in part by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services, the Greene County Legislature and donations.

Proposals are requested by the Greene County Youth Bureau funding for youth programs sponsored by any 501(c)(3) (Non-profit tax-exempt charitable organization per IRS). Programs must serve Greene County youth as outlined in the instructions, The funding available in this Request for Proposals (RFP) is for programs that operate between October 1, 2023, and September 30, 2024. The full RFP and forms required for the 2023-2024 period are available on <a href="http://greenegovernment.com/departments/human-services/youth-resources">http://greenegovernment.com/departments/human-services/youth-resources</a>. Award announcements will be made starting May 1, 2024.

New for this period will be distinct avenues of funding: Youth Development Programs, Youth Sports & Education Funding, and Youth Team Sports Allocation Funding.

- Youth Development Programs (YDP) Programs and initiatives that enable youth to build on their strengths; provide opportunities for youth to gain important life skills and core competencies, and that allow youth to have meaningful roles in their communities; initiatives that benefit young people in their homes and neighborhoods, in schools, as well as in foster care and residential treatment.
- Youth Sports & Education (YSEF/YSEFI) Programs that provide a variety of sports for a broad range of youth; encourages a wide and flexible definition of sports that includes organized activities with movement, including physical fitness activities. Infrastructure (i.e. field improvements, storage units) will be a consideration.
- Youth Team Sports Allocation (YTS) Provide awards to support youth team sports Intended to provide support to local team sports programs across New York state in
  communities where such programs may be scarce. Unlike YSEF, YTS has a sole focus
  on team sports. A "team sport" is defined as an organized physical activity in which
  groups of two or more individuals are in competition with two or more opposing
  individuals. Sporting activities with competition on behalf of an organized group (i.e.
  singles tennis, team golf, swimming or skiing) are included in this definition.

# NEW DATA SUGGESTS THAT TOO MUCH "SCREEN TIME" INTERFERES WITH INFORMATION PROCESSING IN INFANTS AND TODDLERS

Researchers from Drexel's College of Medicine recently published in the Journal of the American Medical (JAMA) association an article which said that babies and toddlers exposed to too much "screen time" may have more difficulty in focusing on the world around them. According to the researchers, children exposed to a lot of TV viewing by their second birthday were more likely to ignore other things going on around them. So, their sensory processing skills appeared to be most affected.

Sensory processing skills involve the body's ability to respond appropriately and efficiently to information received by hearing, seeing, touching, and tasting. The researchers looked at 2011-2014 data on television or DVD watching by babies at 12, 18, and 24 months from the National Children's Study of 1471 children nationwide. The ability to process sensory information was assessed at 33 months using a measure called the Infant/Toddler Sensory Profile (ITSP) which is completed by parents/caregivers.

As of 2014, children age 2 and under in the United States averaged 3 hours, 3 minutes a day of screen time, up from 1 hour, 19 minutes a day in 1997, according to a 2019 research letter in *JAMA Pediatrics*. Some parents cite exhaustion and inability for affordable alternatives as reasons for the screen time, according to a July 2015 study in the *Journal of Nutrition and Behavior*.

#### The findings suggest that:

- 12 months: Any screen exposure compared to no screen exposure was associated with a greater likelihood of being very reactive to the environment. These children exhibited irritability, hyperactivity, eating and sleeping struggles. This is perhaps related to being overly excited by what was viewed on screens.
- 18 months: Every additional hour of daily screen time was associated with the increase in exhibiting high sensory behaviors (i.e. being easily upset, crying, etc.) and avoiding interacting with their environment.
- 24 months,: Each additional hour of daily screen time was associated with an increase in high sensation seeking behaviors (i.e. being demanding, being difficult to soothe, etc.), being sensitive to the environment, and avoiding sensory interactions.

The findings of this study add to a list of concerns for how screen time affects the development of infants and toddlers. The amount of screen time an infant/toddler is exposed to appears to be linked to the development of language delays, behavioral issues, sleep struggles, attention problems, and problem-solving development.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) discourages screen time for babies under 18-24 months. Live video chat is considered by the AAP to be okay, as there may be benefit from the interaction that takes place. AAP recommends time limitations on digital media use for children 2 to 5 years to typically no more than 1 hour per day.

"Parent training and education are key to minimizing, or hopefully even avoiding, screen time in children younger than two years," said senior author David Bennett, PhD, a professor of Psychiatry in Drexel's College of Medicine."

Although the current research looked strictly at television or DVD watching, and not media viewed on smartphones or tablets, it does provide some of the earliest data linking early-life digital media exposure with later atypical sensory processing across multiple behaviors. The authors said future research is needed to better understand the mechanisms that drive the association between early-life screen time and atypical sensory processing.

# SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (SYEP) YOUTH OPPORTUNITY FOR JULY - AUGUST 2024

The Columbia Greene Workforce Investment Office has begun the recruiting process for youth between the ages of 14-20 in Columbia and Greene counties for the Summer Youth Employment Program. Eligible participants will be provided meaningful work experience, while receiving financial literacy education, career guidance and a summer income. All participants will be required to attend a mandatory in-person orientation at Columbia-Greene Community College.

The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) is funded by the Office of Temporary Disability and Assistance (OTDA). The Columbia Greene Workforce Investment Office (WIO) anticipates funding for both Columbia and Greene counties. Typically, the program runs for six weeks throughout July and into August. WIO provides the worksite and youth participants with an in-person orientation prior to the start date.

Eligible participants work for approximately 20 hours per week, earning minimum wage (\$15) per hour. More hours may be offered depending on funding received. The Workforce Office provides an interest profile form listing general career clusters for participants to indicate their preference.

The application deadline is May 3, 2024, which may be extended depending on the number of applications received. Every school district in Columbia and Greene Counties has been sent the SYEP application.
